## **F & E Adds Three County Treasurers' Offices to Check 21 Imaging**

F & E Check Pros announces the recent addition of the Geauga, Stark, and Medina county treasurers' offices utilizing their DCP software for Check 21 imaging and remittance processing.

According to Medina County Treasurer John Burke, his office is familiar with check imaging.
